1. Confessions of a Bookseller by Shaun Blythell; NF; bookstore owner in Scotland explores the impulse to share books, and idiosyncratic encounters with readers (and non-readers)
  2. Circe by Madeline Miller; award-winning US writer's richly imagined long life of the half immortal nymph Circe, and the power of women's self-belief and determination
  3. Wherever She Goes by K. L. Armstrong; fast-paced mystery of a child abduction, or was it?
  4. The Giver of Stars by Jojo Moyes; in 1940's rural Kentucky a group of very different women come together to start a travelling library, riding horses to distribute the books
  5. From the Ashes by Jesse Thistle; NF; First Nations Canadian writer's memoir of his education, challenges and eventual triumphs
  6. Lenny's Book of Everything by Karen Foxlee; Australian writer's tender, funny and poignant story of a boy with a rare condition, and the sister and family who love him, set in US mid-West
  7. In This Grave Hour by Jacqueline Winspear; award-winning Maisie Dobbs mystery series, set in London as WWII is declared
  8. Dual Citizens by Alix Ohlin; Can; Giller Prize shortlisted UBC's chair of Creative Writing's story of two very different sisters, and their close but tumultuous relationship
